

COVID 19 Risk Assessment

Coronavirus disease (COVID-19) is an infectious disease caused by a newly discovered coronavirus.

Most people infected with the COVID-19 virus will experience mild to moderate respiratory illness and recover without requiring special treatment. Older people, and those with underlying medical problems like cardiovascular disease, diabetes, chronic respiratory disease, and cancer are more likely to develop serious illness.

The best way to prevent and slow down transmission is be well informed about the COVID-19 virus, the disease it causes and how it spreads. Protect yourself and others from infection by washing your hands or using an alcohol based rub frequently and not touching your face.

The COVID-19 virus spreads primarily through droplets of saliva or discharge from the nose when an infected person coughs or sneezes, so it is important that you also practice respiratory etiquette (for example, by coughing into a flexed elbow).

Currently, there are no specific vaccines or treatments for COVID-19 at present (May 2020).

 Currently vaccines Oxford/AstraZeneca and Pfizer/BioNTech are in production and a UK wide vaccination process is in progress (Dec 2020

All clothing will be removed from the manakins prior to course.

*Trainer will have own CPR Manikin for the purpose of CPR & choking demonstrations.

Candidates should wash hands with soap and water before demonstrating Primary Survey, Secondary Assessment, or any practical elements to the course. Hand gel sanitiser will also be available.

Primary Survey – Individual resus manakins will be provided where possible

Secondary Assessment/ Recovery Position – Candidates will use a full-size manikin individually if available. This will be thoroughly sanitised in between candidates.

CPR - They will be provided with a disposable training face shield for the duration of the practical's and assessments which each candidate needs to ID as their own. This provides a shield of protection.

Choking – Each candidate will use their allocated manakin for the choking practical.

Trainer Automated Adrenaline Injectors - Candidates to clean their hands with alcohol gel or wipes before using AAI pens.

Any consumables such as face shields and manakin lungs will be disposed of safely and appropriately after use and doubled bagged. Trainer will dispose of appropriately.

Thorough cleaning with the appropriate cleaning wipe or sanitiser after each use. Including the whole face and chest, legs, and arms – and any other area touched. Allow to air dry before next use.

The choking vest will not be used

AAI pens should be sanitised in between as appropriate.

| | Respiratory Protective Equipment Public Health guidance on the use of PPE (personal protective equipment) to protect against COVID-19 relates to health care settings. In all other settings individuals are asked to observe social distancing measures and practice good hand hygiene behaviours | To minimise the risk of transmission of COVID-19 the following additional measures should be carried out if required — Trainer will use a disposable FFP3 mask. It must be used appropriately and disposed of in the correct manner. Candidates should be given a disposable 3 ply face mask for any training deemed higher risk if the 2m social distancing rule cannot be applied. Cloverleaf Training will be using a Full size dummy, individual CPR dummies for the purposes of any demonstrations required for practicing and assessing Primary Survey, Secondary Assessment and CPR skills. Please see Appendix B for further details. Having a large room that is well ventilated and ensuring at a minimum 2m social distancing rule is applied reduces the likelihood of having to use RPE. | |
| | Waste Disposal All waste produced during training including consumables such as wipes, training face shields and manikin lungs will be placed in an appropriate bag and tied and doubled bagged. 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Appendix A Cleaning of CPR/Full Manakin

Before Training

- Each manikin will be fully cleaned using the appropriate wipes such as Trionic decontamination wipes or similar
- All consumables such as lungs and filters will be replaced after each candidate check the "Clean" sticker in date and correlates to last use if not or unsure replace these consumables.
- Removable manakin face should be cleaned with warm soapy water before every use. This is the responsibility of the Trainer.
- All clothing to be removed.

During Training

- Disinfectant wipes such as Trionic and Azo wipes should be supplied during the training for the candidate to use during the practical's, as necessary.
- Candidates should use an appropriate face shield mask while performing ventilation breaths as a further form of protection.

After Training

• Candidates will be shown how to remove all consumables from the CPR dummies. They will then dispose of these and their face shield in the in the appropriate rubbish bag provided by the trainer.

<u>Appendix B Cleaning of all other training practical equipment such as training limbs (arms & legs), AAI pens, Bandages & tourniquets</u> Before & After Training

• Each item should be cleaned using appropriate wipes such as Trionic decontamination wipes or similar. Bandages should be washed using warm soapy water and air dried if possible, outdoors in the sunshine.

During Training

• Should be wiped down before and after use by each candidate using suitable disinfectant wipe such as Trionic and Azo wipes. Bandages should be given to candidates to use for the duration of course. Once used should be placed in a sealed container for appropriate cleaning.

NB – Good hand hygiene before, during and after is paramount.
